Aim

This course will support practitioners in adult and children's services to respond to children affected by parental substance use.

By the end of the training, participants will be able to:

- Identify the impact of parental substance use on children.
- Describe the child's change cycle in parental use and recovery.
- Practise the assessment of risk for children affected by parental substance use.
- Identify ways to actively engage and hear young people's stories.

Course Length and Format:

This course consists of 7 hours learning using the following format:

Part 1: SDF Drug Awareness: An Introductory Course e-learning module (1hr).
